Fun Ways to Tech-i-fy Formative Assessment

Effective formative assessment has the ability to give you an “at-a-glance” snapshot of the way in which students are progressing through a specific learning goal. Whether you want to take a quick poll, gather feedback about a recently completed task, or employ the use of “exit tickets” in your music classes, technology can make job fun and engaging.

In this session, we'll look at a few of the tech tools that can be used across mixed devices:

- Game-show style quizzes with Kahoot
- In-depth questions and exit tickets with Socrative
- A one-device solution with Plickers
- Interactive video questions (great for listening exercises) with PlayPosit

Simple Ideas for Music Tech in the Primary Classroom

Discover simple and effective ways to incorporate technology into your music classroom. We'll look at easy, fun lesson ideas you can use straight away, how to use technology alongside your current curriculum and which software and hardware choices to make. This session will include things you always wanted to know but were too afraid to ask!

This workshop is ideal for teachers who:

- would like some “use it tomorrow” tech ideas
- would like to explore new ways of presenting familiar units of work
- are being encouraged to incorporate more technology into their teaching
- are looking for simple ideas to foster musical creativity in students
